SUPPLY LIST:

10x12 piece of muslin
10x12 piece of "warm and natural" batting
embroidery needle
straight pins
frame 8x10 (optional)

FLOSS COLOURS:

DMC 310 black
DMC 613 vy lt drab brown
DMC 902 vy dk garnet
DMC 3031 vy dk mocha brown

Supply List

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10x12 piece of "warm and natural" batting
embroidery needle
straight pins
frame 8x10 (optional)

Floss

DMC 310 black
DMC 613 vy lt drab brown
DMC 902 vy dk garnet
DMC 3031 vy dk mocha brown

Stitching Instructions

- Trace pattern onto muslin with pencil or disappearing ink
- Place muslin over warm and natural and pin in place
- Using 2 strands DMC 3031 stitch verse
- Using 2 strands DMC 613 stitch face
- Using 2 strands DMC 310 stitch eyes
- Using 6 strands DMC 902 stitch hair, satin stitch nose and stitch “x’s” for mouth

Finishing your stitchery

Now you are ready to tea or coffee stain your stitchery. I coffee stain (¼ cup instant coffee mixed with some hot water and some vanilla in a spray bottle) and bake for a few minutes at least 2-3 times @ 250°F, spraying again between each baking. You can now frame your stitchery or sew it into a cute pillow.
